Simple and Effective ways to Support your Student

Whether you're a seasoned veteran when it comes to sending your student off to college, or this is your first experience, the start of the fall semester can often be an overwhelming time for all parties involved. For first-year students in particular, many feel excited, emotional, and likely a little bit nervous. You may be wondering whether or not your student will be able to succeed. You know what they're capable of and that they're anxious to do well, but you still have some concerns. Fortunately, you are sending your student to a campus that is full of caring and supportive people who are looking out for them even when you can't. There are still a variety of ways that you can be helpful however. Below are some useful tips that can assist you in supporting your student in a productive way.

Talk to Them.

Keeping the lines of communication open with your student is key to not only maintaining a healthy relationship with them, but it is the best way to identify any potential challenges that they might be facing that require intervention from someone on campus. Be aware of the stressors your student may be facing and talk to them about their specific concerns.

Encourage Them to Ask for Help.

Encourage your student to ask for help, but not necessarily from you. This is a time where students are learning to take initiative and become more independent. It is important that your student learns what resources are available

and when to reach out for assistance. Reassure them that RU-C has programs and services on campus with experts who can effectively help them navigate any pitfalls or challenges.

Be Prepared for Changes.

College is a time of ongoing transition for your student—a time that also comes with a sense of loss, especially for parents. Students often seem different after they've been in college for a while (sleeping habits, hair styles, how they view themselves, how they interact with family). Try not to make snap judgements on the quality or character of these differences, but instead, try to appreciate that your child's view of the world is expanding.

Be Encouraging.

Show your enthusiasm for this new experience to inspire your student to be open to change, even when they feel overwhelmed. Be understanding and serve as a source of support when they experience a setback or disappointment, and be forgiving when they make mistakes. Even as you are watching them transform into their own identity as young adults, they are still seeking, and can benefit from, your guidance and support.

It is important to continuously refer to the "check documents" tab at www.financialaid.rutgers.edu until an award has been processed completely.
